Admissions

I didn't apply to Brock, can I amend my application?

Yes! Simply log in to your OUAC account using your reference number and password. Visit ouac.on.ca for more information. Additional fees may apply.

When will Brock send out offers of admission?

Many offers of admission have been made, and will continue to be sent until early May. Please contact us with any questions regarding the admissions process or the program you've applied to at futurestudent@brocku.ca or 905-688-5550, x4293.

Will I be considered for all of the Brock programs on my application?

If you've received an offer to your first choice at Brock, you will not hear from us with additional offers. If you've received your first choice and now prefer another choice, please go to ouac.on.ca and make an amendment to your application no later than the end of April. Please advise futurestudent@brocku.ca of the change.

I've received an offer to an alternate program. When will I know if I will be accepted to my preferred program?

If you are completing courses this semester, you will automatically be reassessed for eligibility for your preferred program in early May - once we've received mid-term results. Work hard!

Why haven't I received an offer from Brock?

If you have not yet heard from us, it could be for one of the following reasons: (1) you may not meet the minimum admission average for entry to Brock; (2) you may not be registered in prerequisite courses for your chosen program; (3) you may not be registered in a minimum of six 4U/M credits. We will assess your application again after we've received your April mid-term grades. If eligible at that time, you'll receive an offer of admission.

Can I complete my sixth 4U/M credit in summer school?

You must email the Office of the Registrar at futurestudent@brocku.ca and notify us that you are attending summer school, and provide proof of registration in the course. Space cannot be guaranteed in all programs.

Can I lose my offer if my final average falls?

Continue to work hard on your studies throughout the next few months! After we receive April mid-term results we will send an email to remind you of the conditions of your offer. If you are concerned that you will not meet the requirements of your offer, you should talk to your guidance counsellor about the option of registering in summer school.

When is the deadline to respond to an offer of admission?

Ontario Secondary School students must respond to an offer of admission from Brock by June 1, 2020.

Awards and bursaries

What is the deadline to apply for awards and bursaries?

Complete our OneApp as soon as possible to maximize your earning potential! Hundreds of awards and bursaries are available via one application. Donor awards with varying criteria and are valued up to \$20,000. Entrance bursaries based on financial need range in value from \$750 to \$3,000. The OneApp closes April 15, 2020. What is Brock's most prestigious award?

Our most prestigious award is the Brock Leaders Citizenship Society Award. These \$8,000 awards are reserved for entering students who combine exceptional academics with leadership in their school or community. Visit brocku.ca/safa for details. Do you have automatic entrance awards?

Brock Scholars Awards are automatic for all incoming students entering their first undergraduate program directly from high school.

\$4,000 (\$1,000 each year)	80-84.9%

Finishing a **Specialist High Skills Major** program?

Graduates entering Brock with an admission average of 80% or higher will automatically be awarded a \$500 scholarship.

Finishing an IB program? Graduates of an **International Baccalaureate** program will receive a recognition award of \$1,000.

When can I apply for residence?
