



Master of Public Health

Delivered in an exclusively online format to both domestic and international students, the Master of Public Health (MPH) program will provide public health graduates with the knowledge and skills to become public health specialists of the future. The MPH program is tailored to meet the needs of public health professionals, health practitioners and recent post-graduate students, with the goal of enhancing their theoretical and applied knowledge through online courses and a mandatory 32-week internship. The curriculum is built on the cornerstone of identifying the interdisciplinary elements required to design, implement and effectively manage public health systems. This degree is designed to provide students with the theoretical understanding and practical knowledge to be able to create, develop, design and evaluate public health strategies that will have a meaningful social impact at the local, national and global level.

PROGRAM DURATION:

Full-time Course Based - 1 year (3 terms)

Part-time Course Based - up to 4 years

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

Four-year Bachelor's degree, or equivalent in Public Health, Health Sciences, Medical Sciences, Social Sciences or a relevant health field. Students with a four-year Bachelor's degree in disciplines of mathematics, pure sciences or business may also be eligible, although additional provisional course work can be required. Minimum 80% (A-) GPA over the last two years of study.

- Knowledge-based proficiency in epidemiology and biostatistics
- Relevant work and/or volunteer experience in a health-related field
